

Parent Perspectives - Why Financial Literacy is Important for Elementary School **Students**

Students make great strides in economic understanding between the ages of 6 and 12. By the time students reach age 12, their understanding of financial concepts is "essentially adult." The primary source for financial education for students this young is their parents. However, we see that while many parents talk to their kids about financial education, few feel prepared to teach their children about basic finance. School-based courses can fill the gap in reliable financial education at a critical time for students.



Student Perspectives - Empowering Students to Manage Their Mental Health

Research shows that equipping students with knowledge and tools such as cognitive-behavioral skills not only improves their ability to deal with stressful situations but it also lays the groundwork for preventing significant mental health issues in the future. Through Mental Wellness Basics, students improve their knowledge of coping strategies, their ability to recognize when they need to deploy coping strategies, and their ability to seek help when they need to protect their mental health.

Student Perspectives - Engaging Students to Prevent Bullying

Honor Code takes a practical approach to bullying prevention by empowering students to create change, whether they're engaging in bullying, on the receiving end of it, or witnessing it in their school.

Among all students, after taking Honor Code:

- More students feel it is their responsibility to prevent bullying at their school (+6 percentage points).
- More students are likely to ask a trusted adult for help dealing with bullying (+7 percentage points).

Among students who have recently participated in bullying, after taking Honor Code:

- More students feel it is their responsibility to prevent bullying at their school (+12 percentage points).
- More students are likely to ask a trusted adult for help dealing with bullying (+13 percentage points).



Student Perspectives - Engaging All Students on STEM

For learners who are already interested in STEM, Endeavor feeds their curiosity by providing real-world context on how they can leverage their skills in a STEM career. For learners who do not self-identify as a "STEM type," Endeavor piques learners' interest by highlighting how STEM concepts and careers connect to topics that interest them, contextualizing and supporting classroom learning with real-world examples.

Among this second group of learners, we see that Endeavor effectively engages these students on STEM topics and opens up the possibility of pursuing a STEM career.

Among the 28% of students who said they were not interested in STEM careers:

- · Half saw a career they were interested in.
- 55% saw a career they could imagine themselves having.
- 35% realized they were the type of person who could have a career in STEM.







Student Perspectives – Activating Students to Create Healthy Communities

Perceptions of social norms are highly prone to error: students tend to overestimate the extent to which their peers endorse negative behaviors and underestimate the extent of endorsement of positive behaviors. This misperception can act as a barrier to action, as individuals tend to avoid engaging in behaviors that they feel would not be endorsed by others around them. Closing the gap between actual and perceived norms creates healthier school communities in which students feel empowered to speak up, take action, and protect their classmates.




